Motorcycles: The Most Dangerous Way to Travel

- Approximately 23,000 people killed in crashes between 2008 and 2013
- 217 deaths per billion miles traveled



- Approximately 113,000 people killed in crashes between 2008 and 2013
- 5.75 deaths per billion miles traveled






Trains: A Safe Way to Travel

- Approximately 125 people killed in crashes between 2008 and 2013
- 0.47 deaths per billion miles traveled



- Approximately 150 people killed in crashes between 2008 and 2013 0.14 deaths per billion miles traveled





- **Planes: The Safest Way to Travel**
- Approximately 55 people killed in crashes between 2008 and 2013 0.06 deaths per billion miles traveled
